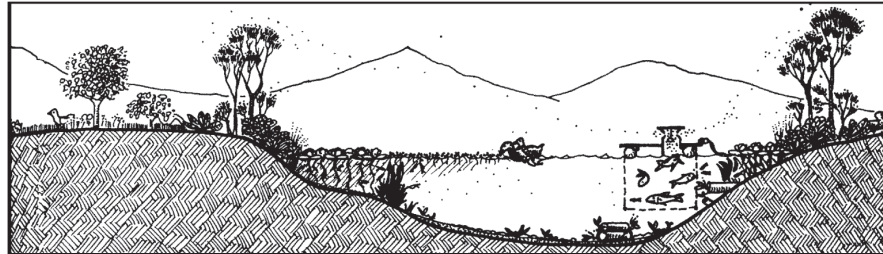


High Altitude Permaculture presents a local Boulder-area Advanced Permaculture Design Course

A unique, locally-based certification course offered by seasoned instructors. Opportunities for in-depth design of physical sites and invisible structures. Case studies and design charettes bring course material to life. Projects range from broad conceptual design to practical planning for implementation, as students work in small teams and on individual case studies. The local nature of the course will facilitate implementation of designs, as well as the evolution of teams over time.

Participants are asked to commit 4 hours per week outside of class for readings, site observation, research, design work and other assignments. Course size is limited.

Sandy Cruz founded **High Altitude Permaculture** in 1992, promoting strategies for sustainable living in even the harshest conditions. She holds a Diploma of Permaculture Design from the International Permaculture Institute, and has been widely published and interviewed. Sandy currently teaches diverse courses, trains new permaculture teachers, and consults on site planning and design. She also serves on Boulder County's Food and Agriculture Policy Council.



Marco Chung-Shu Lam has been practicing and teaching permaculture and sustainable living skills for over a decade in diverse climates. Originally trained by Bill Mollison, the founder of permaculture, Marco currently teaches permaculture at Naropa University. He is also the clinical director of the **Mandala Clinic**, where he practices acupuncture and Taoist medicine. Marco is working on a silver-based complimentary currency to be released soon.

Alison Peck first encountered permaculture in 1979, and it has shaped her life. In 1984 she founded **Matrix Gardens**, a landscape design/build company inspired by permaculture and edible landscapes. She has designed single family homes, multi-family developments (including Nyland Co-housing), subdivisions and large permaculture 'farms'. She has taught permaculture, landscape design, xeriscaping, edible landscaping, sustainable landscaping and drip irrigation. Alison is also the founder of the Front Range Sustainable Landscaping Coalition (FRSLC).
